



President's Message

The year 2020 was our COVID Pandemic Year that we'll always remember – our lives seemed to stand still with schools and businesses closed, events cancelled, and travel restricted. There are some 100 members of LAHHA, all with a unique approach to equestrian activity and a neat story to tell – I hope you appreciate this year's scrapbook!

In the past year LAHHA has sponsored or participated in a number of activities that support our mission – to promote and cultivate the use, ownership, and care of horses in Los Altos Hills and neighboring communities. Our organized equestrian activities in 2020 were limited to group trail rides due to the COVID Pandemic. Our Activity Schedule for the coming year is on hold pending a lifting of the state and county social distancing directives and some sense of “return to normal” as the COVID vaccine is distributed and begins to take hold.

This past year, your LAHHA Board continued to provide an active voice in preserving and promoting an equestrian “vibe” in our community. Our board members regularly attend meetings to engage with the Mid-Peninsula Open Space District, Town Council & Committees, and we network with other equestrian organizations throughout the local region – all for the purpose of advocating for trails, preserving and expanding our open space, challenging zoning changes that threaten to impinge on riding, horse safety, and boarding areas, and maintaining our public Town Riding Arena. This past year LAHHA organized the repair of the wash rack and the gates at the Town Arena and we frequently worked with town maintenance crews to correct pathway deficiencies (downed trees, obstructions, debris). **SPECIAL THANKS** to our Town Public Works Dept. for their excellent support to the Arena and pathways!

In the following pages of this newsletter you will find “horse highlights” from many of our members looking back at the past year. I hope that you enjoy reading about your fellow equestrians as much as I did in assembling these stories!

Lastly, the final page of this newsletter is your annual membership renewal. I hope that you will stay engaged in LAHHA. Your annual dues will help support our insurance costs for our events, mailing and printing expenses, incidental expenses associated with our events, and selected capital costs during the year to maintain the Town Arena and associated equipment.

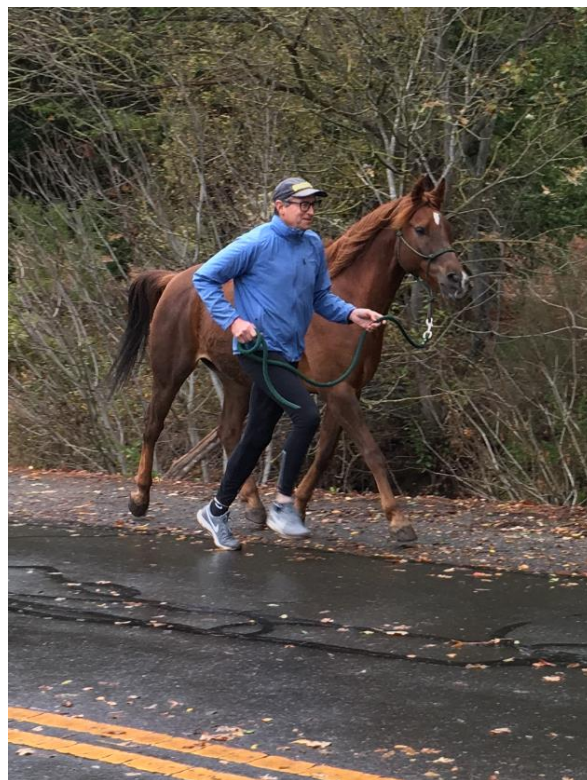

Los Altos Hills Horsemen's Association – A Peek into the Past 1976-1984

Many thanks to LAHHA's Carole Gottlieb for giving us this peek into the past with a summary of our LAHHA Newsletters from 1976-1984. After re-reading some of the Fast Tracks dating back to 1976, one can see that the Horsemen's Association continues to fulfill its mission by keeping a strong line of communication open to the horse community as well as the Community at large.

At the end of 1976, Jitze Couperus had just taken over the reins of the Association from Pete McSweeney who was one of the founding members of the Association. The topic of concern was the saving of Westwind Barn. The club's focus centered on Clinics, Horseplay, Tack Swaps, a sprinkler system for the ring and clearing a new path along the Lands of Newman from Elena to Black Mountain.

In 1977, the topics ranged from the organization of the Westwind Barn by the Friends of Westwind, an outstanding 40th "Horseplay" at Hidden Villa, and the honoring of Frank and Josephine Duveneck, Artemas Ginzton, and Bob Stutz for their roles on behalf of the Horsemen's Association. More Trail clearing was performed along the Lands of Newman.

In 1978, the second annual Tack Swap was held, and worming clinks were held at the Town Ring. Costs were \$12.50 for worming - \$10.00 for Tetanus, - \$10.00 for Sleeping Sickness and \$7.50 for flu. Also, a "Candidates Night" was held in February. One of the questions asked was "What is your commitment towards maintaining the existing trails as well as towards expanding the trail system?" Sounds familiar!! Candidates were Bob Cheney, Larry Giller, Tom McReynolds, and James Nystrom.

No Newsletters from 1980 were available; however, in a letter from Nancy Couperus, President, Friends of Westwind Barn, she discusses the broader use of Westwind Barn and the fact that there is a watering trough, tie rack, and picnic area available to transient horseman who wish to stop by the barn.

In 1981, Rich Swan took over the presidency of the Horsemen's Association. Proof of the Horsemen's Association existence was sealed in the Time Canister buried under the Flagpole at Town Hall. Linda Tellington-Jones held a clinic at Westwind Barn with part of the proceeds going to the Westwind 4-H Riding for the Handicapped Program.

Regina Davis took over the reins of the Horsemen's Association in 1982. The Town and Pathway Committee were congratulated for the passage of the Town Master Path Plan in March. The Horsemen were given 30 redwood posts by the Town to the mark more paths with the official trail insignia, a footprint within a horseshoe.

In 1983, the club continued to sponsor clinics, the first with Debbie Sereni at Town Hall and second with Walter Wright at the home of Doni and Sid Hubbard. The 46th Annual "Horseplay" was held at Hidden Villa.

In 1984, Bob Stutz took over the reins of the Horsemen's Association. The Club held another Candidates Night, and a restoration of the Town Ring. The biggest issue was a bid of over \$6,000.00 for fixing the ring's drainage system. A local civil engineer offered to oversee the construction and sign off on it when complete without charging his usual fee. Many thanks to the engineer!

Once again . . . thanks to Carole Gottlieb for this "peek into the past"!
